**16-19 Bursary** – The 16-19 Bursary Fund aims to encourage participation by young people who face financial barriers to learning. There are two types of bursary, namely:

- 1. A bursary of up to £1,200 a year for young people in the following defined vulnerable groups:
  - a. in care;
  - b. care leavers;
  - c. young people in receipt of income support or universal credit in their own name;
  - d. disabled young people in receipt of Employment Support Allowance <u>AND</u> Disability Living Allowance or Personal Independence Payments in their own name.
- 2. Discretionary bursary awards made by the Sixth Form to young people in ways that best fit their needs and circumstances. Bursary awards are targeted towards those young people who face the greatest financial barriers to participation; such as the costs of transport, meals, books and equipment.
