The Cathedral bowlers proved too strong for our lower order batsmen and we were unable to score the required three runs off the last ball of the game. My thanks go to the players for playing the game in such a good spirit, parents who came to support and of course the staff at Ledbury CC for being so hospitable and providing such a wonderful facility for our students to play cricket over the years.

The Y7's played in their county final against Cathedral on the 5th July. On a hot and humid day, the Cathedral batsmen got off to a flyer with some well grooved shots and clever placement. JMHS students bowled well
