Course content:

The course content for the first year of A level will aim to develop students broad knowledge and understanding of the core areas of Psychology. During their second year, students will engage in issues and debates in Psychology as well as studying, in-depth, a number of key topics.

1	Externally assessed written examination on: Memory, Attachments and Social Influence, Psychopathology	120 mins
2	Externally assessed written examination on: Approaches in Psychology, Biopsychology, Research Methods	120 mins
3	Externally assessed exam on: Issues and debates, Relationships, Eating Behaviour, Forensic Psychology	120 mins

Skills acquired:

- Knowledge and understanding
- Interpretation and analysis
- Research skills
- Presentation skills; an ability to explain behaviours from different psychological perspectives.

Links with other subjects:

Biology PE, Maths, Geography, English.

Possible careers:

Psychology professions e.g. Clinical Psychologist, Sports Psychologist or Educational Psychologist. Any people-centred career eg Teaching; Counselling; Retail Trade or Management.

Prior experience:

Minimum: GCSE Level 5 in Maths, English and Biology [or Double Science] to take A level Psychology
