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Dear students, parents and carers

Today we held a socially distanced whole staff meeting with the majority of staff joining us in person in the theatre and some joining us via Microsoft Teams to communicate our plans for the phased return of Year 10 and Year 12 students and to agree next steps for other year groups. It was lovely to see so many of our staff in person for the first time in several months and to see their enthusiasm and commitment to providing the best education that they can in these difficult circumstances.

I am very much looking forward to seeing our Year 10 and Year 12 students from next week, but I am disappointed that it seems very unlikely we will see students in Year 7 to Year 9 before September. I would like to reiterate that we have been incredibly impressed with the resilience and discipline students are showing with working from home. Our monitoring (which is not 100% accurate) indicates that between 80% and 90% of students in Years 7-9 are being conscientious or very conscientious with completing work with a higher figure in Y10 and close to 100% of Y12 students. In order for us to review the quality of online work we are setting and so that we can make further improvements, I have inserted below a link to a short online parental survey which should take 10 minutes to complete.
