Water cycles and Insecurity	This topic looks at the importance of water on the planet. The water cycle operates on different scales and short and long-term timescales. It examines the circulation of water on the land, in the oceans and in the cryosphere. The topic then begins to examine the reasons and consequences behind water insecurity and the management strategies that can be put into place to ease this problem.  The topic examines the 3 key enquiry questions:-  1) What are the processes operating within the hydrological cycle from global to local scale?  2) What factors influence the hydrological system over short- and long-term timescales?  3) How does water insecurity occur and why is it becoming such a global issue for the 21st century?  This is assessed through a mixture of short and longer 12 mark 'essay' style questions	Formal assessment:  45 minute end of topic assessment including skills questions, short answer questions and an extended writing task.  Informal assessment:  True/false quizzes Homework Review questions Literacy tasks
Health, Human Right and Intervention	This topic looks at the variations in the norms and laws of both national and global institutions that impact on decisions made at all scales, from local to global. As well as the impact of geopolitical interventions on both human health and wellbeing and human rights.  This is looked at through key questions: -  1) What is human development and why do levels vary from place to place?  2) Why do human rights vary from place to place?  3) How are human rights used as arguments for political and military intervention?  4) What are the outcomes of geopolitical interventions in terms of human development and human rights?  This question will be assessed using a ranger of short 6-mark questions to longer 20 marks essay questions.	Formal assessment:  45 minute end of topic assessment skills questions, short answer questions and an extended writing task.  Informal assessment:  True/false quizzes  Homework  Review questions  Literacy tasks
