Appraising	 End Point: to understand how the Musical Theatre genre developed, and how selected composers contributed to this Students will study the development of musical theatre, focussing mainly on six selected composers (Rodgers, Bernstein, Sondheim, Schwartz, Lloyd Webber, Schonberg) Students will study in depth a selection of works by these composers, learning to identify, analyse and appraise key features of the genre Students will develop aural appraising skills Students will learn how to compare and contrast works that have a common theme 	Students will be assessed through knowledge checks and exam style questions
