Performing	<ul> <li>End Point: to perform a minimalist piece of music as part of an ensemble</li> <li>Students will explore Steve Reich's 'Clapping Music' and learn how phase shifting is used</li> <li>In small groups and as a whole class students will attempt to play 'Clapping Music'</li> <li>Students will explore Terry Riley's 'In C' as a class, and learn how different motifs can be combined in different ways to create an ever-changing and unique performance</li> </ul>	Students' performance skills will be monitored and assessed through verbal feedback from teacher and peers. Students will also be encouraged to self-assess their own performances.
Composing	<ul> <li>End Point: to create a piece of music that shows understanding of minimalist techniques</li> <li>Students will learn how to use minimalist techniques in their own composition</li> <li>Students will learn how minimalist techniques can be combined to develop melodic motifs</li> <li>Students will learn how to create atmosphere through music</li> </ul>	Students' compositions will be monitored and assessed through verbal feedback from teacher and peers.
Appraising	<ul> <li>End Point: to aurally identify minimalism techniques</li> <li>Students will learn about the context of minimalism and understand the different compositional techniques</li> <li>Students will listen to a range of minimalism works, including key composers such as Reich, Riley, Glass and Cage</li> <li>Students will learn how to identify and describe the ways that minimalism techniques are used</li> </ul>	Students will be assessed through knowledge checks and exam style questions.
