The BTEC Tech award L1/2 Travel and Tourism consists of one externally assessed exam and two internally assessed components, each having two coursework projects. 1: Component 1 Travel and Tourism Organisations and Destinations – 2 pieces of internally assessed, 3 externally moderated coursework. 30% of the qualification. 2: Component 2 Influences on Global Travel and Tourism – 2 hour written examination. 40% of the qualification. 3: Component 3 Customer Needs in Travel and Tourism - 2 pieces of internally assessed, externally moderated coursework. 30% of the qualification. Drawn from the components in section 3 (above), teachers have used a range of evidence to make grade judgements. Full paper assessment from mock exam in Year 10 – Centre Assessed Grade was submitted in summer 5 2. Students' responses to amended past paper assessments throughout spring and summer term 2021 3. Students' responses to Component 1 and 3 coursework pieces 4.
