Rationale for A-Level English Literature Teacher Assessments 2021

This year students will receive grades awarded and determined by teachers, with students only assessed on what they have been taught and based on the standard at which they are performing.

Teachers have been asked to draw on a range of evidence when determining grades, including the optional use of questions provided by exam boards, as well as mock exams, coursework, or other work completed as part of a student's course, such as essays or in-class tests.

The Process for awarding a Teacher Assessment Grade (TAG) for A-Level English Literature at JM6:

- At JM6, A-level English literature in Y13 is taught by two experienced teachers.
- These teachers have taught A-level English literature for many years, both the new and old specifications.
- A-level English Literature has three written papers and one NEA element.
- Throughout the course, the English department keeps records of data to order to calculate performance.
- Specification weighting of different components are considered when calculating performance.

• The range of evidence used ensures that all Assessment Objectives are covered. Furthermore, all syllabus components will be considered when calculating the TAG. The evidence used and weighting will be as follows:
