Students will also be encouraged to self-assess their own compositions.
Musical Theatre (June-July)	<ul> <li>End Point: to perform an ensemble piece from a Musical</li> <li>Students will learn how composers write for musicals with a focus on case study composers (Lin Manuel Miranda, Andrew Lloyd Webber, Cole Porter)</li> <li>Students will listen to and watch example performances and analyse these as a class and in groups more independently</li> <li>Students will work in ensembles to arrange, rehearse and perform a piece from a musical</li> </ul>	Students' performance skills will be monitored and assessed through verbal feedback from teacher and peers. Performance criteria for GCSE will be shared so students understand how this links to requirements in year 10 and 11. Students will also be encouraged to self-assess their own performances.
