Continuing COVID-19 testing at home

We have been delighted with the way our students have continued to take two COVID-19 tests per week at home. This has made a major contribution to keeping our school and community safe. It is important that the regular testing continues and in particular that all students have a COVID-19 test before they return either today or before school tomorrow morning. This will ensure a safe start to term for all.

When testing it is important to:

1. Avoid eating or drinking for at least 30 mins before doing the test to reduce spoiling the tests.

2. Read the test result after 30 minutes - set a timer to help you remember. You should not wait any longer than 30 minutes.

Parents and carers need to log the results twice:

- 1. Online with the government test and trace site at www.gov.uk/report-covid19-result
- 2. You will also need to inform the school of the result by completing a short form, using this link <u>Student test result reporting form</u>.

If a positive result is received, your household will need to self-isolate and you should also immediately inform the school by either phoning Reception or emailing <u>admin@jmhs.hereford.sch.uk</u> as we will need to identify close contacts and ask them to self-isolate. Detailed instructions about home testing and full guidance in the event of a positive result can be found on the school website, <u>https://www.jmhs.hereford.sch.uk/</u>.

If your child develops any Covid-19 related symptoms, your household must immediately self-isolate and book a PCR test, regardless of the LFD (home) test result.

From 1 March 2021, if you are a member of a household, childcare bubble or support bubble of staff or a student (but not a secondary school student, a primary or secondary school staff member), it is recommended you also get tested twice a week. Communications with parents and visitors to school

In order to keep our school and the wider community safe, we will continue to minimise the number of visitors to JMHS and encourage parental meetings to be via phone or Microsoft Teams. Please do not come onto school site unless you have an appointment booked. If you do have an appointment, please ensure you wear a face covering at all times and remain two metres distant from students and staff.

Please could we ask that your son or daughter checks their equipment carefully before leaving for school as we cannot accept items brought in by parents and carers if students forget them.

Grades for Year 11 and Year 13

The government has confirmed that in summer 2021, students taking GCSE, AS and A levels regulated by Ofqual, should be awarded grades based on an assessment by their teachers. The DFE have stated that:

'Teachers can use a range of evidence to make a judgement of the grade they are performing at. Students should only be assessed on what they have been taught, ensuring sufficient coverage of the curriculum to enable progression. When determining the grade, teachers should reflect the standard at which the student is performing now, not their potential.

Teachers should use the time remaining to balance continued teaching with any assessments they want to undertake. Work done at home can be included as evidence to support a teacher's judgement if it cannot be produced in the school or college environment because of the pandemic, and where teachers are confident that it is a student's own work.'

At JMHS each GCSE, Advanced Level and vocational subject has planned how they will assess students. They have determined which tests, coursework, practice exams, homework and other tasks already taken by students can be included and what further assessment will take place between now and May Half Term to make a fair and balanced judgement on Teacher Assessed Grades (TAGs) for each student.

We have published a summary of how students are being assessed for each subject on a new area of our website, so that every student and parent can check how they are being assessed for all their subjects

Year 12 Exams

To give Year 12 students the maximum amount of time to prepare for their end of year exams, these have been scheduled from Monday 28 June to Wednesday 7 July. These exams are used to help teachers enter predicted grades for university applications. We recommend that students commence revision for these exams as soon as possible, reviewing work covered in the first two terms over the Easter holiday. Subject teachers will provide detail on how and what to revise and tips on exam technique during the Summer Term.

Year 10 Exams

Year 10 students will take practice exams covering content covered so far in their GCSE courses from Monday 14 June to Friday 25 June. The practice exams are the first stage in preparing students for their GCSEs next summer. The exams are likely to be taken in classrooms rather than the exam hall due to COVID-19 restrictions.

Assessments for students in Year 7 – Year 9

Students in these year groups will continue to take in class tests and assessments rather than sitting an end of year exam.

Teachers are preparing a summary of the topics to be covered this term with key learning points listed for each topic. These will be posted on the school website during the first week of the Summer Term so that parents and students can see an overview for the term.
