

Top-Level Overview for Key Stage 3 Curriculum: Geography

1. Endpoint for the end of Key Stage 3:

- Students will develop an appreciation of interdependency and dynamism between people and the environment.
- Students show confidence with key geographical literacy of human, physical and environmental processes e.g. tectonics, river processes and globalisation and climate change.
- Students will be exposed to geographical enquiry, allowing them to deepen their conceptual understanding through reasoning, interpreting and analysing data.
- Students develop a mutual respect for all which is evidenced in a positive class ethos that challenges the misconceptions of the world around us.
