

Top-Level Overview for Key Stage 3 Curriculum: Citizenship

1. Endpoint for the end of Key Stage 3:

Students will be able to use and apply their knowledge of the following:

- The development of the political system of democratic government in the United Kingdom, including the roles of citizens, Parliament and the monarch
- The operation of Parliament, including voting and elections, and the role of political parties
- The precious liberties enjoyed by the citizens of the United Kingdom
- The nature of rules and laws and the justice system, including the role of the police and the operation of courts and tribunals
- The roles played by public institutions and voluntary groups in society, and the ways in which citizens work together to improve their communities, including opportunities to participate in school-based activities
- The functions and uses of money, the importance and practice of budgeting, and managing risk
