Course content:

This is a rigorous advanced technical qualification on a par with A Levels. Learners will be equipped with the skills and skills to progress straight into the creative and performing arts industries. The musical theatre pathway enables to students to undertake specialised learning that can be accurately matched to specific career outcomes in the creative and performing arts industries.

- Rehearse and display musical theatre skills
- Initiate and develop repertoire
- Understand contextual issues relating to performance styles and genres, and the performing arts industry

Skills acquired:

You will learn advanced performance techniques in acting, dance and singing. In singing students will explore breathing techniques, diaphragm control, projection and communication skills. They will need to learn to sing in an ensemble using excellent listening skills. Dance will focus on the development of movement skills and communicate in different styles and genres. They need to focus on strength and conditioning. Through acting, students will develop their voice and movement skills; the creation of dramatic relationships and communication of ideas, themes and contexts.

Links with other subjects:

This is an exceptionally practical subject area which prepares students for the vocation of performing arts. It has natural links with A Level Music and Drama and thematic links with English and Psychology.

Possible careers:

This course is an excellent choice for students wishing to pursue careers in the theatre, law, politics, arts therapy, journalism, creative arts, teaching, marketing, advertising, events management or arts administration.

Recent Arts students have gone on to study for degrees in: Law, English Literature, Modern Foreign Languages, Psychology, Musical Theatre, Technical Theatre and Stage Management, Dance, Event Management, Performing Arts, Art Therapy, Music and Recording, Drama, Maths, Teaching, Business and Accountancy, Medieval History, Art.

Prior experience: It is recommended that you will have studied some Performing Arts at GCSE level. However, exceptions can be made on the condition that you have experience of performing to an audience and have a good grade in English. You must be able to communicate clearly and effectively on paper as well as verbally.
