History Around Us: Ludlow Castle c.1080-the present	<p>Curriculum goal – Students will understand the reasons for and nature of changes in the role of Ludlow Castle since the Norman Conquest.</p> <p><u>Students will:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Understand why Ludlow Castle’s site was chosen ➤ Know how and why the purpose and use of the site has changed over time ➤ Know how events involving Ludlow relate to the wider context of British history ➤ Compare Ludlow Castle to other similar sites (Chepstow, Wigmore, Goodrich) <p>*How far students get with this unit will depend on whether their group has had 2 or 3 lessons per week during Yr9</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Formative assessment - Knowledge content reviews in each lesson ➤ End of module tests for each time period
