Subject overview for: Personal, Social, Health, Religious & Economic Education (PSHRE)

1. Subject overview

The aims of the PSHRE faculty at JMHS include;

- Giving young people information they need to develop healthy, nurturing relationships of all kinds, not just intimate relationships
- Developing knowledge about safer sex, sexual health, the law, delaying sexual activity and avoiding harmful behaviour and abusive relationships
- Keeping young people safe online and through all ICT activities
- Increasing understanding of physical health and mental wellbeing, promoting self-control and self-regulation, whilst signposting when to seek support and how to access it
- Providing a balanced programme of careers and economic education so that young people approach the future with knowledge, understanding and confidence

Well delivered PSHRE programmes have an impact on both academic and non-academic outcomes for pupils, particularly the most vulnerable and disadvantaged. Students are supported to develop their understanding of key areas of Health, Relationships and Sex, Careers and Skills, Economic Health, Online safety and many other areas to keep them safe and well prepared for life through a study of a broad range of topics.

All students are provided with PSHRE education via several different mechanisms, including bespoke workshops delivered by Designated Safeguard Leader trained senior pastoral staff (e.g. Year Leader or SLT member – 6 workshops per year), tutor delivery (every day), specialist delivery through the Science faculty (9 modules), assemblies, guest visitors, topical (weekly picture news resource) opportunities, literacy/class reading PSHRE texts (Year 7-11) and cross-curricular activities. Students have opportunities to develop literacy, language and vocabulary through PSHRE themes. This rich diet of delivery ensures that a comprehensive package of PSHRE learning is enjoyed by all students.

Almost every topic provides a learning opportunity for discussion, investigation or analysis of equality and values – messages that can be explored and reinforced many times and in a variety of contexts.

6. Contribution to careers provision

Careers is one of the core strands of PSHRE provision at JMHS, with tutor delivery in every year-group through the school, special events and focus weeks, and an online START package for students to track their journey through careers education.
