Points to note

Year 10 German Sequencing Rationale

Autumn: Students begin GCSE German revisiting another K3 topic topic – Home – describing where they live, a typical day and building on their food vocabulary, including a cultural look at German specialities. They move onto health and technology with opportunities to practise key skills such as photo cards, using different tenses and the language of debate. New structures such as um...zu are introduced to improve their writing. To practice this new language, there are guided writing tasks on the pros and cons of technology. Students also consider for first time how to deal with extracts from literary texts in the reading paper.

Spring: Students study the city of Vienna. This provides cultural awareness of Austria, but also introduces lots of practical and situational vocabulary, which is important for the role play element of the speaking exam. The module includes booking travel and accommodation, understanding directions, ordering in a restaurant and shopping, which are all common scenarios for the GCSE speaking role plays. Students are introduced to the polite forms of address (Sie, Ihnen). Comparative and superlative adjectives are revisited to improve the quality of writing.

Summer: Students start abroad - focusing on types of holidays, destinations and weather. They build on key vocab from spring term and revisit the structure um...zu, which is developed to add other structures to express intent. A look at past holidays means lots of key past tense practice. A cultural study of the island Sylt retrieves vocabulary for describing where you live from the autumn term. It also means we focus again on advantages/disadvantages and making comparisons, which are essential to the Higher 150 word writing task in the GCSE mock paper sat at the end of the year. This year provides many opportunities to build both key writing skills such as tenses, the structure um..zu and the language of debate as well as develop speaking skills such as photo cards and role play tasks.
