Course Content

- Approaches in Psychology, Biopsychology and Research Methods
- Issues and debates, Relationships, Schizophrenia, Forensic Psychology

- Critical thinking skills
- Research skills
- Presentation skills
- An ability to explain behaviours from different psychological perspectives
