

The 16 to 19 tuition fund for the academic year 2023/24

The Education and Skills Funding Agency (ESFA) have provided additional funding for the academic years since 2020/2021 up to and including 2023/2024 for schools, colleges and other 16 to 19 institutions to mitigate the disruption to learning arising from coronavirus (COVID-19).

John Masefield High School and Sixth Form Centre (JMHS) have been allocated £1,553 from this funding stream for the 2023/2024 academic year. Our planned spend is £6,721

At JMHS, we will ensure that we maximise the impact of this additional funding by working to the following principles:

- We will target support based on attainment records and our knowledge of individual students and the disruption they have experienced to their learning.
- Tuition support will be provided over and above the timetabled teaching for that course.
- Support offered will be based on an individual needs assessment
- Sessions will be run by subject specialist teachers or tutors.
- Tuition will generally be offered on a group basis (ideally in groups of 3 - 5 students at a time). Individual tuition may be offered where appropriate.

Selection of eligible students:

We have used eligibility for the 16-19 bursary as an indicator of priority. In addition, we have used internal data which identifies those students who are currently the furthest behind expected progress in specific subjects: GCSE results and our Year 12 exam results are the primary indicators for this. No student will receive tuition in more than one subject.
