Mrs Fox has also been an excellent form tutor and Year Leader supporting so many of her students to achieve success.

With Mr Henderson he has put in place IT systems which are effective, efficient and great value for money. On GCSE results day, if you have achieved the entry criteria for your chosen subjects you will have a congratulations letter inside your GCSE results envelope. If you are happy with your chosen subjects please log onto your application form and accept your **Enrolment** offer. Mrs Laidler will be in Sixth Form room 6 to support with this if needed. If you would like to change any selected subjects, then please book an appointment for Tuesday 27 August.

Tuesday 27 August 10:00 – 14:30: If you have not quite got the results you needed or wish to change your subject selection, then you will need to attend this Enrolment day for approximately 20 minutes. You will be able to meet a member of the Sixth Form team to discuss your plans and suitability for your chosen courses, and then complete the enrolment form. Staff will be available on GCSE results day to answer questions so that you can consider your options carefully before coming in. Please book an appointment with Mrs Laidler in Sixth Form room 6 after you have collected your results.

Post-Results Services

Members of staff will be available on both results days so that students can discuss their results and, if necessary, consider whether they wish to request any post-results services. Fuller details about this will be included with each student's results information.

Mr Peggs, Exams Officer, and a number of other staff will be available on both exam results days between 2:00pm and 4:00pm to help with decisions about the best service to choose in each situation. Students will need to personally sign any consent forms in order to process a request.

We have a supply of good quality second-hand uniform, including a limited supply of PE uniform, please contact Mrs Chadney at <u>val.chadney@jmhs.hereford.sch.uk</u> for more details.

Uniform and equipment checks will continue from September 2024.

Students are expected to be prepared with the following equipment every day, to ensure prompt starts to lessons:

- Pencil case with <u>at least</u> two black pens
- A ruler
- For Year 7 & 8: Reading Book

- A green pen
- A pencil

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• For Years 9-11: Scientific Calculator

A large water bottle

- Their school timetable (tutors will issue a copy on the 1st day)
- Long hair must be tied up for practical lessons students with long hair will therefore also require a hairband as part of their equipment

PE lessons: Earrings and plastic nose studs are to be removed – students who have new ear piercings will be allowed to tape for 6 weeks to allow healing, then must remove piercings (if this is the case, please ensure students are prepared with their own earring tape).

Students are expected to wear their uniform correctly at all times:

Black shoes/plain black trainers

Black socks / plain black tights

Trousers / shorts / skirt at a professional length (no more than 10cm from the top of the knee cap to bottom hem of shorts/skirt)

Coats must not be worn instead of a school sweatshirt

Hoods on coats/jackets must only be worn up when outside and it is raining

Hooded coat/jackets without a full-length zip are not permitted

Permitted jewellery – 1 x watch, 2 x plain earring studs, 1 x clear plastic nose stud

(No bracelets, necklaces, hooped earrings – these will be confiscated until 15:20)

Students are not permitted to wear coats/jackets during Registration or lessons

No false nails or coloured nail varnish

No false eyelashes

Hair is to be natural colours - avoid "wash in" colours over the summer as these often cause issues on return in September

Please ensure any new piercings are done at the start of the school holidays to ensure studs can be removed on return to school in September.

Mobile phones are not to be used by students on school site, unless they have specific permission from by a member of staff. Any student seen using their mobile phone will have it confiscated until the end of the school day and will receive an after-school detention. Sixth Form students are permitted to use their mobile phone in the Sixth Form Centre.
